MEMORANDUM FOR All Personnel, TSC ARNG Garrison Camp W. G. Williams

SUBJECT: Commander's Safety Policy

1. As the Camp Williams Commander I have the responsibility, as well as a personal concern for the safety of the soldiers, employees and visitors of Camp Williams. My safety policy is to eliminate all accidental manpower and monetary losses, provide for the more efficient use of resources and enhance the readiness of the Utah National Guard. The only acceptable accident rate is zero.
2. Accidents produce catastrophic effects. They not only destroy our assets but also soldiers, employees and their families. All accidents can and must be prevented. I expect all officers, non-commissioned officers, supervisors and enlisted personnel to set the example by knowing and enforcing safety standards in the areas for which they are responsible and perform their duties.
3. Unsafe conditions will receive immediate attention resulting in corrective action. Unsafe acts by individuals will not be tolerated and immediate corrective actions will be taken to include disciplinary actions, if appropriate.
4. Professionalism at all levels and in all areas is essential to ensure that all activities are conducted in a safe and efficient manner. Every soldier and employee can help by reporting hazards, making corrective actions and performing their duties to the standard to which they have been trained.
5. I expect safety to receive major emphasis in all activities at Camp W. G. Williams.
