

FTNGDCD INFORMATION BRIEF

To be filled out (initialed, signed and dated) by the Soldier/Airman applying for orders and reviewed and signed off by an approved MACOM representative in the Soldier's/Airman's command.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen will contact the Personnel Service Branch (PSB) to update the DEERS system and for issuance of Active Duty ID Cards. DEERS enrollment status is the key to securing benefits. Contact the PSB for appointment by calling 801-432-4337. DEERS information is available at 1-800-538-9552.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD orders for any length of time greater than 30 days qualify for medical benefits through TRICARE. These Soldiers/Airmen should insure that they and their families are properly enrolled and understand these entitlements. Soldiers/Airmen who wish to know more about TRICARE enrollment and benefits should schedule an appointment with G1 Medical at 801-432-4922.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD are authorized leave at a rate of 2.5 days per month. This leave must be used during the period of the order. Orders will not be extended for the purpose of using leave.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD are required to submit to an initial and periodic urinalysis testing. This is in addition to testing done at the unit level.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD are required to continue attending all IDT/IAT and AT functions. Any TDY, Leave or activities for the Counterdrug Task Force (CDTF) that conflict with unit drills or other unit requirements require the unit commander's release before CDTF will allow the activity. It is the Soldier's/Airman's responsibility to obtain that approval.

_____ A police records check is conducted before receiving FTNGDCD orders and may be conducted any time during the duration of the order. Conduct unbecoming of a Soldier/Airman may cause you to be released from FTNGDCD orders.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD must meet medical retention standards in accordance with AR 40-501, Chapter 3 and AFI 48-123.

_____ Most positions within the CDTF require a DoD security clearance of Secret or higher. Soldiers/Airmen whose clearance is suspended or revoked, may be subject to early separation procedures as outlined in NGR 500-2. Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD will promptly report all matters which could affect their clearance (i.e., debt delinquency, arrest, law enforcement investigations, allegations of misconduct even if not fully adjudicated, etc.) to both the CDTF Security Manager and their unit chain of command.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD are required to uphold the highest standards of conduct and personal appearance. Outside employment associations and off-duty conduct/activities must be consistent with federal directives on ethics and within state and federal conflict of interest policies. Outside employment must be cleared with the Officer in Charge and the CDTF commander.

_____ Soldiers/Airmen on FTNGDCD may potentially retire with an Active Duty retirement, but continued employment is not guaranteed as the program is subject to year to year funding.
