


**Library News**

**Flashback**

Published in The Richfield Reaper, 28 years ago today, July 27, 1983 — When Richfield Librarian Norine Jensen read that free books could be obtained through Sen. Orrin Hatch's (R-Utah) office that was all she needed to know. With the city library on a rather skimpy budget and with

the cost of books rising rapidly, she quickly wrote his office and requested some of the free books. Then several weeks ago eight boxes containing over 200 books arrived at the library from the senator. They were mostly duplicate titles that had been stored on military bases.

Sevier Valley Medical Center now testing for sleep apnea.


**Simple Test for Sleep Apnea (Snore Score)**

- Yes or No - Are you a loud, habitual snorer, disturbing your bedroom companion?
- Yes or No - Do you feel tired and groggy on awakening?
- Yes or No - Do you experience sleepiness and fatigue during waking hours?
- Yes or No - Are you overweight?
- Yes or No - Have you been observed to choke, gasp or hold your breath during sleep?

If you answer yes to any of the above, you should discuss your symptoms with your physician.
