SCR business leaders tally up wins in national competition

Snow College Richfield Phi Beta Lambda — Professional Business Leaders — chapter participated in a national PBL competition in Orlando, Fla., June 23-26.

Those representing SCR at

the event included Mindi Luke and Jeannie Youngkin, both Richfield; Holly Moore, Salina; and Ryan Topham, Aurora; as well as Monica Anderson and LaFaun Barnhurst, advisers.

The local chapter brought home four individual and three chapter awards from the competition, according to Anderson.

Individual honors went to Luke, who scored third place in free enterprise project, and ninth in computer applications; as well as Youngkin, who took ninth in both community service project and local chapter annual business report.

In addition to being named a PBL Career and Membership Achievement Program winner for the western region, the chapter also received an award of merit as a 2011 gold seal chapter, and earned second place honors for the largest local chapter in the professional division.

Moore, who represented the chapter in public speaking, and Topham, who participated in justice administration, also joined forces to compete in the desktop publishing team event.

Utah colleges brought home approximately 40 awards from the national contest, which featured more than 1,800 competitors from colleges and universities throughout the country, participating in more than 60 events, according to Anderson.

PBL is a national business education association designed to prepare students for careers in business and business education, according to Anderson. Along with the Future Business Leaders of America — high school clubs — its members belong to more than 12,000 chartered chapters, including students from the United States, the Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and Europe.
