


Warm holiday glow

Fire department changing

New chief announced along with retirement of a 41-year veteran

The Richfield City Fire Department is set to undergo some changes at the dawn of 2012.

In addition to building a new fire station, the department will have a new chief and will say goodbye to one of its

longest tenured members. Lance Nay is set to take over the job of chief as of Jan. 1, 2012.

"I'm a little nervous," Nay said. "I have the time now, so I thought I could give it a try." The challenge of making Richfield's new fire station progress from a paper drawing to reality is expected to be the fire department's biggest challenge of the next year, Nay said.

Nay works for the state of Utah as a technical assistance specialist. He has been serving as the assistant chief under Chief Bryan Burrows. Burrows is now set to serve as the assistant chief.

"It's been me and Lance, now it's going to be Lance and me," Burrows said. "It's been a good experience." Burrows said he would like to see the new fire station completed, and is happy he will still be involved with it.

The position of chief is something that has become a part of Burrows over the past six years, he said.

Burrows said the associations with people from across the state that have been afforded him through the position would be missed.

Burrows said retiring mem-

ber Stan Poulson will also be missed.

"He has provided a lot of service to this city," Burrows said. "He has been a good friend to me and the department." Burrows said Poulson has probably responded to more than 1,500 fire calls through the years.

Poulson's time with the fire department came as a result of him following in his father's footsteps.

"My dad was on the department for more than 30 years," Poulson said. "So, it's one of those things."

In more than four decades of service as a volunteer firefighter, Poulson has served in a variety of positions, including chief.

"It's time to stop," Poulson said. He said he plans to continue his work with the Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve organization, as well as his job with Magleby Mortuary.

"It's a good public service," Poulson said. He said he's going to miss the association with the other 24 members of the department, and he is proud of the work they do.

"It's one of the few departments the city never has to worry about," Poulson said.
