




Jacob Davis

Triple Deuce training continues

A month after leaving the area, the 2nd Battalion 222nd Field Artillery of the Utah Army National Guard continues to train at Camp Atterbury, Ind.

"Everything is going well out here in Indiana," said Capt. Cody Workman. "When it rains here, it really rains."

The 222nd was visited by a group of bosses from southern Utah as part of the Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve Boss Lift program. Members of the program from Sevier County included Kenneth Jensen, Darwin Ogden, Clay Morgan, Craig Anderson and Mike Turner. The boss lift members had the opportunity to visit with soldiers and witness some of the training currently being undertaken by the Triple Deuce.

"The guys who came out on the boss lift can tell you all about the rain," Workman said. "Most of the time it is hot and humid, but that does not slow down our outstanding soldiers. I have been blessed with an opportunity to work with some exceptional men."

Workman said the soldiers of the 222nd have provided a great example of commitment to their families, the unit and the mission.

The Triple Deuce has been engaged in training and preparation for its upcoming mission to Iraq.

"We expect to be training here for another few weeks," Workman said. "Camp Atterbury is a great training site and there are a lot of great ranges and other training aids available to our soldiers."

Since the Triple Deuce is not being deployed as artillerymen, the unit's primary focus, the group is working on a lot of basics, Workman said.

"Our training is a mix of re-

inforcing doctrinal basics and studying the evolving tactics of the enemy so that we can be best prepared for what is happening in country today," Workman said. "We do quite a

bit of training on basic soldier skills such as first aid, navigation, mounted and dismounted patrolling and, of course, counter-IED [improvised explosive device] drills. It has

been good training. A lot of it has been driven internally and our young leaders are doing a fantastic job of providing realistic and relevant training for our soldiers."

F-16s buzz Richfield

The four F-16s that flew over the Richfield Fourth of July parade were not just randomly flying through the area.

The planes were on a mission that has been a Hill Air Force Base tradition for more than 25 years.

In addition to Richfield, the planes flew over West Point, Murray, Provo, Delta, Clearfield, Hooper, Riverdale, North Ogden, Huntsville, Morgan, Vernal and Park City.

Richfield City Councilman Richard Barnett said he found out about the program last year. After making a few calls to Hill, the squadron was committed for its flyby of Richfield.

Cities or events that would like an F-16 flyover are required to have approval of the Pentagon, which can take up to six months.

One killed in Interstate 70 rollover

SALINA — A 31-year-old Glenwood Springs, Colo., woman was killed in an accident July 5 on Interstate 70 near Salina.

According to an accident report compiled by the Utah Highway Patrol, Paula M. Dalitz was driving a 1998 Honda CRV east on wet roads in rainy weather. The CRV hydroplaned, sending it into the median, where it overturned and rolled across the west-bound lanes of I-70.

Dalitz was killed when her head struck the asphalt, according to the report.

Two passengers, also from Glenwood Springs, Juan Carlos Rafeal Dalitz, 32, and a 15-year-old, were also injured and transported to Sevier Valley Medical Center in Richfield in critical condition. All occupants in the vehicle were using seat belts, according to the UHP.
