Utah Army Guard's 204th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade Conducts Change of Command

CAMP WILLIAMS, Utah – The Utah Army National Guard's 204th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade, will conduct a change of command Saturday, August 18, at 9:00 a.m. on the parade field at the Utah Training Center, Army Garrison Camp Williams, 17800 So Camp Williams Road, Riverton.

At the ceremony Col Robert T. Dunton will relinquish command to Lt. Col. Thomas C. Fisher.

Dunton has commanded the 204th since 2010. His military career began in 1982 and he was activated for Desert Storm, and the 2002 Winter Olympics. He deployed in support of Iraqi Freedom and again in 2005 in support of Operation September Storm, providing support to the Vermilion Parish and to the City of New Orleans. COL Dunton is married to Diane and lives in Herriman with their three children.

Fisher's last assignment was as a student at the U.S. Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, PA. His deployments and mobilizations include Operation Iraqi Freedom, the 2002 Winter Olympics, and the relief efforts from Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Fisher lives and works in Grand Junction, Colorado where he is the Internal Services Director for Mesa County Government. He is married to Sheri Holden Fisher. They have three sons, Jake, Ben and Ross Eisenhauer.

Fisher will assume command of approximately 1,000 Soldiers located in 10 communities across Utah.
